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Girraween Primary School Reporting to Parents Policy

Background

In the Northern Territory, schools must:

- give parents at least one written report each semester
- have at least one formal interview with parents each school year
- allow informal discussion between teachers and parents when requested
- distribute the National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) student report to parents of participating students (in years 3,5,7 and 9).

These are the minimum reporting requirements. It is expected that schools will provide other opportunities to report to parents and guardians, students and the community.

Objectives

The purpose of reporting is to support student learning by providing information to students and parents / carer about student achievement, progress and to indicate areas for further development. A student's report provides a formal record at a point in time on the student's progress and achievement.

Implementation

Regular communication between teachers and parents / guardians is encouraged. If parents / guardians have concerns about their child's learning, they should raise these with the teacher at any time rather than waiting for formal interviews. Regular communication between home and school is encouraged. If parents / guardians wish to meet with the teachers, they should make an appointment to ensure that an appropriate amount of time is available.
